PSHE

Design a poster showing stereotypes of boys and girls and add positive messages to break these stereotypes. e.g. pink can also be for boys and blue can be for girls

Maths

Write your own addition and subtraction number sentences that have a 2-digit and 1-digit number e.g. 26 + 3, 85 - 2
